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SUMMER LEARNING INFORMATION

About the Remedial Summer Learning Program:

The purpose of the Summer Learning Program is to **recover credit for courses that were failed during the school year**. Students enrolled in the Summer Learning Program will typically take <u>one</u> or <u>two</u> courses. In some situations, students may be required to take more courses in order to meet their academic requirements or to help them recover additional credits/learning.

Summer Learning Program 2023 Dates:

Monday, June 5th through Friday June 9th

Monday, June 12th through Thursday, June 15th

Tuesday, June 20th through Thursday, June 22nd (No School on June 19th)

Monday, June 26th through Thursday, June 29th

Summer Learning Program 2023 Times:

Students must attend either one or two sessions daily (based on their course requirements).

Session 1 runs from 8:30 AM to 11:00 AM

Session 2 runs from 11:30 AM to 2:00 PM

Attendance Requirements:

- > Students are expected to attend each day and to arrive promptly.
- ➤ There will be no sessions on Monday, June 19th
- > Students may miss a day with a doctor's note. Extensions will **not** be granted past **June 29**th.

Summer Learning Program Location:

Carlisle High School—Swartz Building

Summer Learning Program Format:

- > Students will be enrolled in online courses to remediate courses failed during the year.
- ➤ Work will be completed on computers, on worksheets, on paper, independently, and/or at school.
- ➤ Work will be submitted either in person or online and graded as such.
- ➤ Carlisle teachers will be present to monitor progress, grade specific assignments, offer tutoring, assist with course content and answer questions.
- > Students <u>must</u> complete each remedial course and earn a grade of <u>at least 65% to pass</u>.

Students are expected to complete all assignments within the provided timeframe. Students may access their courses at home to either stay on track for completion, or to get ahead in their course(s). A student may successfully complete their required course(s) prior to the end of summer learning session in which case they will not be required to attend. Students will receive a written form from the principal to acknowledge the completion of the course.

Credit and Grades:

Students who successfully complete a Summer Learning Program remedial course will receive credit for the course which will count toward graduation. The transcript, however, will reflect the grade of 65%. If the student takes an alternate course to the course failed during the school year, the student may have an opportunity to earn a percentage grade reflective of 100% to 0% (these are high school elective courses only).

Tuition:

Thanks to the hard work of those in Central Office at CASD we are able to use ESSER funds to cover the cost of the Summer Learning Program. The 2023 Summer Learning program will be at no additional cost to the students.

Transportation:

Transportation will not be provided for the Summer Learning Program. Please plan accordingly.

Registration: Open - Monday, May 1st, 2023 through Thursday, June 1st, 2023

High School: Students who have failed a course during the 2022—2023 school year will automatically be registered for The Summer Learning Program. These students will be enrolled in core courses first and then electives if possible. Parents must confirm enrollment by June 1st to finalize enrollment.

Students who wish to recover credits from previously failed courses (2020—2021 or 2021—2022 School Years) must meet with counseling and complete the attached form by May 19th.

Middle School: Students register for Summer Learning Program through the online application.

Headphones:

We strongly encourage students to bring their own headphones in order to listen to online content

Parent/Guardian Communication:

Students and Parents/Guardians will need to provide a valid email address in order to create student and parent/guardian accounts. Parents/Guardians will be able to login at any time to see their child's progress. Parents/Guardians will receive a weekly progress email from the online provider or Summer Program Teacher (Middle School). Formal progress reports will <u>not</u> be mailed home as both students and parents/guardians have regular access to the program to check status.

Behavior:

Students are expected to exhibit respectful behavior in relation to themselves and other students as well as any adults with whom they have contact during the Summer Learning Program. All district disciplinary policies remain in effect and failure to meet expectations may result in immediate dismissal from the program.

Use of personal electronic device(s), including phone(s), are not permitted while students are in session. Use of devices during the session may result in **immediate dismissal from the program**.

Dress:

Appropriate attire is expected—standard CASD dress code applies to the Summer Learning Program.
