Grade Level:	Grades 8-12

Duration:	MS 48 Minute Periods / HS 85 Minute Periods
Frequency:	MS 180 days / HS 90 days
Pre-Requisites:	None
Credit:	1 Credit
Description:	Spanish I builds the foundations of language acquisition with an emphasis on use of the target language for communication. Most of the class is conducted in the target language with emphasis on the skills of listening, reading, speaking, and writing. Students will be exposed to grammar as part of interpretive activities to be followed by instruction. Students will be required to demonstrate their proficiency through both prepared presentations and writings as well as impromptu interpersonal conversations. Students will be asked to make cultural and linguistic comparisons and will be encouraged to find opportunities to use their acquired skills through the exploration of diverse cultures and communities.
